Climbing routes

VIA FERRATA PONOIG (POLOP)
El Ponoig is a challenging, mainly vertical ferrata on an athletic, aerial, spectacular circuit. Plenty of modern equipment, comprised mainly of clamps;

Level: Moderate / Length: 2 km

PUIG CAMPANA (CENTRAL SPUR)

This is one of the most popular routes, a classic way to climb Puig Campana. It is around 450 metres long.

Level: Moderate to difficult / Length: 4.7 km

LA PEÑA MAURA (GUADALEST)

La Peña Maura belongs to the climbing area in Guadalest, which now has more than 100 routes.

LA PEÑA ALCALÀ (GUADALEST)

A 100-metre vertical rock face that requires extremely strong arms. Its south-easterly orientation makes it a very pleasant option in winter.

Walking routes

SERRA GELADA WALK (FROM BENIDORM TO ALBIR VIA THE LIGHTHOUSE)
This route crosses the marvellous Serra Gelada from one side to the other. There are fabulous 360° views during the entire walk. On one side, the cliffs and the sea, islands and fish farms; on the other, the Puig Campana, La Sierra de Benia and the Peñón de Ifach.

Level: Moderate to difficult / Length: 8 km

BENIDORM-PUNTA DEL CAVALL

This short, harnacked path is on the slopes of the Serra Gelada and runs between the sea and the mountains to Punta del Cavall and the Torre de Les Caletes watchtower.

Level: Easy / Length: 2 km

BENIDORM - CRUZ DE LA SERRA GELADA

The Cross overlooking Benidorm is in a spectacular spot affording panoramic views of the city skyline. This beautiful walk is of medium difficulty.

PUIG CAMPANA


Intrepid visitors have the option to hike to the top of the second-highest mountain in Alicante province.

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It's never been so easy to combine the mountains and the sea. If you add a year-round pleasant climate to the mix, Benidorm and the Marina Baixa become an excellent option for walkers and climbers.

With towering 300-metre cliffs and covering more than 5,600 hectares, the Serra Gelada Nature Park in Benidorm is the Valencia Region's leading land-sea park in a magnificent setting along the shores of the Mediterranean. A choice of organised routes takes visitors to intricate coves to discover flora and fauna, to gaze out over the Punta del Cavall or to see the lighthouse of Albir.



Hiking

Benidorm has hikes for all types of people of all ages and levels of fitness. The great location and rugged terrain around Benidorm make it an ideal choice for mountain lovers wanting to explore amazing beauty spots such as Serra Gelada, Sierra Cortina and Puig Campana, to name just three.



Climbing

The Marina Baixa has become a year-round destination for a growing number of keen climbers, who find the vertical challenges they are looking for in this region.

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Recommendations for mountaineers in Benidorm

- 1^o Be respectful with nature.
- 2^o Stick to the paths.
- 3^o Don't light fire.
- 4^o Don't throw trash.
- 5^o Keep quiet, do not shout or frighten the animals.
- 6^o Be prepared: suitable footwear, water and some food.
- 7^o Respect private property.
- 8^o When climbing, be aware of dangers.
- 9^o Be mindful of other users.
- 10^o Take care with barriers.
