













Rastro El Cisne. This flea market is located in the outskirts, in the direction of Alfaz del Pi, close to La Huerta and near the Ermita de Sanç. It is held weekend mornings (approx. from 8:00 to 13:30 h.). There you can buy interesting second-hand products and during the rest of the week several antique shops will also open where you can find real gems, both vintage and collector's items. You can also enjoy live jazz music by various groups that enliven your visit to the market.



During the summer, there is a handicrafts market at Plaza de la Señoria which operates from mid-afternoon until past dawn, where you can find leather jewellery, silver jewellery and gemstones, handmade soaps, miniatures, pottery, juggling, macramé, foam puppets and decorative items. At the same time in the adjoining square, Plaza del Castillo, you will find time artists and portrait painters, exhibiting their work and, in some cases, taking orders.

During one week in May, a **medieval market** with food court is installed at Parque de Elche, and in October, a **traditional products market** is held to celebrate the Day of the Valencian Community.







Shopping

After a day at the beach, theme parks, sports activities or a day outdoors, there is nothing better to complete the day than going shopping.

Benidorm has more than 2,000 stores spread across all districts, although the highest concentration is in the heart of the city, where you will also find many well-known fashion franchise stores

The large **shopping area** runs from Plaza Triangular up to Avenida de Los Almendros, extending through the main streets of the old town and city centre, including La Alameda, Gambo, Martinez Alejos and Paseo de la Carretera.

Here the stores operate as a large outdoor shopping mall by the sea, where you can buy everything from high fashion and electronics to true bargains. Most of the streets are pedestrian, so it is best to leave your car behind to not miss a window.

During the summer, many downtown establishments are open all week, including Sundays, and have extended hours so visitors can shop at sunset without renouncing the beach and leisure time.

There are several public and private car parks in the downtown area that are open 24 hours a day, where you can leave your car for a day of shopping.
