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And when night comes, its time to live it up. The city is **open till dawn**, making it perfect for those who like to party. Dance non-stop at the pubs and clubs along the Levante beach. Sit at a terrace bar and feel the sea breeze. Get ready to hear electric guitars of the best rock music. Or visit the nightclubs on the outskirts of town. Whatever you choose, Benidorm will be waiting for you the next night.

The Old Town is where young people usually meet to kick off the night. You will find pubs playing the latest Spanish music in Calle de los Gatos, Costera del Barco or Calle la Palma.

The Levante beach area is full of life until 4 am. There are lounge bars with chill-out music and open-air terraces where you can have a drink and nightclubs playing electro latino, dance and house music, where it all revolves around the music. Rock also has its place, with various American-style bars offering live performances and providing a meeting place for a Sunday afternoon.

And those who are still going strong after 5 am can head for the nightclubs on the old main road. Most of them close at dawn, although some of them also stay open after hours.

The British area is the Rincón de Loix, around Calle Gerona, Calle Ibiza, Calle Mallorca and Calle Londres, and the entertainment starts there towards late morning. There are live music pubs with tributes to legendary bands and artists.

There are taxis and microbus services for groups that move from one area to another in Benidorm.

Festivals are just another pretext for enjoying a fun summer in Benidorm.

LOW FESTIVAL. This is a well-established festival, one of the best in Spain, confirmed by the 75,000 people that attend it each year. It is a 100% sustainable festival with an excellent line-up of national and international artists. It has placed Benidorm on the map as the capital of Indie.

IBERIA FESTIVAL. Good old Spanish rock&roll never dies, and nor do its fans, who consist of several generations that get together and chant the songs that have become anthems to them.

BENIDORM PRIDE. This festival is held in early September, filling the city with colour, music and revelry to celebrate Gay Pride. A week of partying and celebrations culminates with the Benidorm Pride Parade.

FUZZVILLE! Winner of Best New Festival of 2015 in the Spanish Fest Awards, this festival of punk, rock and underground music is a must for September.

Every year Benidorm is a popular stop-off on some top-level music tours. Stars like Rolling Stones, Bruce Springsteen or David Guetta have played here during recent summers.

The fact that there is **accommodation for all budgets** is another of this city's appeals. We have camp sites, apartments and more than 120 hotels rated from one to five stars, all of which are excellent value! Occupation in summer is around 90 percent. So don't miss out!

You can also try scuba diving and snorkelling in small coves like Tío Ximo and La Almadrava with their crystal-clear waters; and if you're already an expert, Benidorm Island is the place for you.

If you love water parks, come and have fun at Aqualandia, with the world's most extreme water slide, and combine it with a visit to the Mundomar marine animal park. If you're looking for an adrenaline rush, Terra Mítica is the park for you. Terra Natura shows you 200 species of animals from all over the world. For those travelling with children Iberia Park with its pirates and open-air spas is a must, as is Aqua Natura, which has more than 1000 metres of water slides for the little ones.
